
Ralph Winslow (1919-2016) - Ayer High School's Number 1 Fan!

Signed with the Atlantic Braves in 1965: Played in Waycross Georgia in the Florida State League.


At 5' 11" entering Ayer Jr. High School, Martha caught the attention of a lot of folks playing basketball. Martha Started all four years 1952-1956.



# **John Speidel**








